

AMEE 2021 Call for Papers

AMEE 2021 is scheduled as a Hybrid Conference from 27-30 August. The face-toface Conference will be held at SEC in Glasgow, UK, with online elements integrated into the programme. Submissions relating to any aspect of health professions education across the continuum of undergraduate, postgraduate and CPD are invited in the following formats:

Preconference & Conference Workshops

Preconference on Friday 27 or Saturday 28 August: 3 hour interactive sessions with up to four facilitators. One free conference registration is given. Workshops will be delivered face-to-face in Glasgow and all facilitators should be present.

Conference workshops on Sunday 29 or Monday 30 August: 90 minute interactive sessions with up to four facilitators. Workshops will be delivered face-to-face in Glasgow and all facilitators should be present in person.



Symposia

on Sunday 29 or Monday 30 August: 90 minute sessions with maximum of 4 presenters and a moderator. One free conference registration is given. Symposia will be delivered face-to-face in Glasgow, and at least two of the contributors must be present in person. Other contributors have the option to join online.

Research Papers & Doctoral Reports

Research papers on Sunday 29 or Monday 30 August:

15 minute presentations, followed by 5 minutes for discussion, in themed sessions with a moderator. Whilst most presentations will be made face-to-face by presenters in Glasgow, there is the option for research papers to be presented remotely and this option is given on the submission form.



Doctoral Reports on Sunday 29 or Monday 30

August: 15 minute presentations, followed by 5 minutes for discussion, in themed sessions with a moderator. Whilst most presentations will be made face-to-face by presenters in Glasgow, there is the option for research papers to be presented remotely and this option is given on the submission form.





Short Communications

Face-to-face or remote on Sunday 29 or Monday 30 August: 10 minute presentations, followed by 5 minutes for discussion, in themed sessions with a moderator. Whilst most presentations will be made face-toface by presenters in Glasgow, there is the option for short communications to be presented remotely and this option is given on the submission form.



On-Demand: Submitters of abstracts accepted for this category will be asked to record a 10 minute video which will be uploaded to the AMEE Resource Centre (ARC). These will not be presented or discussed in Glasgow but will be available in the ARC for access by conference participants throughout the conference and afterwards. Submitters must register for the conference but have the option to attend either in person or online. (*Please do not send a video until requested to do so.*)

ePosters

Face-to-face or remote on Sunday 29 or

Monday 30 August: 4 minute presentations followed by 2 minutes for discussion, in themed sessions with a moderator. Whilst most presentations will be made face-toface by presenters in Glasgow, there is the option for eposters to be presented remotely and this option is given on the submission form.

On-Demand: These will not be presented or discussed but will be available on the Learning Toolbox platform and through the ARC for access by conference participants



throughout the conference and afterwards. Submitters must register for the conference but have the option to attend either in person or online.



Whilst we recognise the ongoing uncertainty resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, we very much hope to be able to welcome participants to Glasgow in August 2021.
